Free Summer Admission to IAIA Museum

Santa Fe’s best summer art bargain just got better, as the IAIA Museum has temporarily suspended its admission fees.

From now through September 30, there will be a donation box adjacent to the Museum’s exhibition area entrances. Visitors are encouraged, but not required, to make a donation to the Museum in lieu of its normal admission fee of \$4 for adults, \$2 for students and \$2 for seniors.

This dramatic change of policy comes during the Museum’s busiest months and includes the weekend of Santa Fe Indian Market, a time when hundreds of art lovers visit the Museum’s Pueblo Revival-style structure on Cathedral Place just one block from the Santa Fe Plaza.

Through September 30 the Museum is featuring “Relations: Indigenous Dialogue”, a contemporary art exhibition showcasing the work of nearly 70 Indigenous artists from across the globe.

From August 18 through November 5, a retrospective of the stunning jewelry creations of Denise and Samuel Wallace, “Arctic Transformations”, will be featured in the Museum’s North Gallery.

The IAIA Museum in downtown Santa Fe is the premier exhibiting institution for contemporary Native and Indigenous art from across North America.
